Immigrant Legal Advocacy Project Elects Alicia Curtis, Esq. as New Board President

Alicia joined the ILAP Board in 2017 and served in several leadership roles prior to being elected President. As a volunteer attorney on ILAP's *Pro Bono* Panel since 2015, she has also helped many people seeking asylum, including several victories in Immigration Court.

She earned a B.A from Reed College, a Master's degree in Social Work from Boston University, and a J.D. *summa cum laude* from the University of Maine School of Law.
